# Apple likely has more App Store deals to make

Changes so far won't cause much pain, but loss of payment exclusivity still possible

Apple Inc. works to negotiate its way out of its App Store troubles, one thing is becoming increasingly clear: the technology titan might have to start competing on its own playing field.

The past couple of weeks have brought some compromises from a company not accustomed to compromising. Last week, Apple said it would begin allowing media apps, which would include services such as Netflix and Spotify, to have an in-app link to their websites. That followed a change announced the week prior that would allow developers to notify customers via email of alternative payment options outside of Apple's own system.

Those changes came as a result of legal pressure, but they fall well short of what other adversaries—and some lawmakers—say is necessary.

Most at issue is Apple's requirement for apps to use its own payment system for in-app purchases. Some critics even want to end Apple's practice of tightly controlling which apps can appear on its devices—a key facet of the so-called walled garden that has made Apple's mobile device ecosystem far more lucrative than the much larger Android platform run by Google. Analysts estimate that Apple's App Store generates nearly twice the annual revenue of Google's Play Store even though Android powers nearly three-quarters of the world's mobile devices, according to market researcher StatCounter.

Apple's walled garden and payment limitations are key issues in the case brought by Epic Games. The federal judge who presided over the trial earlier this summer is expected to issue a ruling soon. A loss would be another serious dent in Apple's armour, but even a victory for the iPhone maker seems unlikely to settle the

issue.

A bill passed last week in South Korea would prohibit Apple and Google from mandating their own payment systems for in-app purchases. Lawmakers in the US and the European Union are considering similar measures. Apple might draw less political flak than fellow tech giants Google, Facebook and Amazon, but its tight control of the App Store and its \$2.5 trillion market capitalization still make it a tempting target for regulators looking to rein in big tech.

Investors should therefore brace for more changes—especially since the ones already announced don't seem likely to cause much financial pain for Apple. A team of Morgan Stanley analysts covering videogame stocks wrote that allowing developers to email users outside of apps "is a higher friction process that will likely only succeed with a minority of gamers." Analysts for Evercore ISI said the changes demanded by the South Korean bill would be "meaningfully beneficial" for dating app providers such

as Match Group and Bumble if also adopted in the US and Europe. Note that Apple's share price has risen nearly 5% since the first set of changes were announced on 26 August, compared with a relatively flat S&P 500 over that time.

Losing the ability to mandate its payment system could threaten a high-margin business expected to generate \$21.6 billion in revenue for Apple's fiscal year ending later this month, according to consensus estimates for the App Store business from Visible Alpha.

It is also possible that many people will choose to keep using Apple's system. The company has had a billing relationship with its core customers since the launch of the first iTunes store in 2003. Pierre Ferragu of New Street Research wrote Thursday that "existing purchase patterns will resist changes in the environment," adding that selling through the App Store "will remain a valuable alternative for app developers." But Apple may need to sell that idea rather than banking on being the only game in its own special town.

# Taliban fighters crack down on protests led by Afghan women against Pakistan

Taliban fighters violently dispersed the first sizable protest in Kabul since last month's insurgent victory, showing that Afghanistan's new rulers won't tolerate public opposition as they prepare to unveil their administration. Tuesday's protest was triggered by the presence in Kabul of Lt. Gen. Faiz Hameed, the head of Pakistan's inter-services intelligence agency, who is involved in talks toward forming a new Taliban-led administration. Pakistan has supported the Afghan Taliban since the Islamist movement was born in the 1990s.

Organized mostly by women, Tuesday's protests started off peacefully, with several hundred marching down the streets of Kabul and chanting, "Death to Pakistan." They also expressed support for the anti-Taliban resistance in Panjshir province, whose capital was seized by Taliban forces on Monday.

At first, more disciplined Taliban units along the way didn't intervene. But once the march reached the city's central Shahr-e-Naw neighborhood, Taliban fighters started beating the protesters with batons and whips, and firing in the air. Several windows at the upper floors of a nearby hotel were blown out as some Taliban gunmen failed to control their muzzles when they unloaded volleys of bullets. Several dozen protest organizers were forced into the basement of a nearby bank, and many others were detained.

"We must continue our protest against dirty Pakistan, which is interfering in Afghanistan. Why is Pakistan not being sanctioned? We will never recognize this government,

which is a puppet of Pakistan and attacks our people and violates women's rights and dignity," one of the organizers, a women's-rights activist in her 30s, said when reached by phone in the bank's basement.

With the advances into Panjshir, the Taliban have essentially extinguished the only remainder of armed opposition to their rule. Tuesday's demonstrations, however, show that they also have to reckon with simmering discontent within the wider Afghan society, particularly in Kabul, a modern metropolis where

many oppose the Taliban's puritan ways. With the country cut off from the international financial system and most foreign aid, long lines have formed daily at bank branches in Kabul as Afghans try to withdraw at least part of their savings.

Bilal Karimi, a Taliban spokesman, mocked Tuesday's protesters, pointing out on Twitter that all of the leaders of the so-called anti-Taliban uprisings, including those from Panjshir, have fled abroad. "All the Facebook and Twitter instigators live in the West, while their sheeplike followers have come to Kabul for demonstrations, disrupting security and order," he wrote. Other Taliban

officials said that the protesters were trying to build asylum cases so they would be able to emigrate to the West.

Leaders of the deposed Afghan republic have long portrayed the Taliban as Pakistan's stooges, trying to harness widespread popular resentment of the Pakistani state. No Afghan government has recognized the British-drawn Durand Line between the two nations as an international border, and Afghan nationalists have maintained for decades that Pakistan's Pashtun-speaking areas should belong to Afghanistan.

Pakistan's Gen. Hameed was spotted in Kabul's Serena Hotel as the Taliban prepare to unveil their new government in coming days. While the movement's supreme leader, Mawlawi Haibatullah Akhundzada, is all but certain to have the last word on major decisions, day-to-day governance is likely to be in the hands of the head of the Taliban's political office, Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar.

Mr. Baradar has already met visiting international dignitaries, including the United Nations' undersecretary general for humanitarian affairs, Martin Griffiths, on Monday. In a sign of outreach to wider political forces, he sat during

that meeting next to the tricolor flag of the fallen Afghan republic rather than the white banner of the Taliban's Islamic Emirate.

Shortly after the 15 August fall of Kabul, Taliban representatives visited key personalities of the former republic who stayed behind in the Afghan capital, such as former President Hamid Karzai and former chief peace negotiator Abdullah Abdullah. More recently, however, Taliban officials have said that leading members of the old regime are unlikely to be allowed to participate in the new administration. In Kabul, opinions were divided about Tuesday's protests. A shopkeeper along the march's route said he agreed with the demonstrators. "The Taliban government, we don't know who is doing what, and whether it is Pakistan that is pulling all the strings," he said. "The banks have no money, the business is in trouble, everyone is talking about a coalition against the Taliban."

The shopkeeper next door held an opposite view. "The previous government was a government of corruption. They are all out there protesting because they can't steal anymore," he said. "The Islamic Emirate brought us security and a true Islamic system."

Across the street, a bearded Taliban official who was released from Bagram prison in mid-August professed ignorance about the protest that passed the area shortly before. Several pickup trucks with Taliban fighters, white bandannas with the Islamic profession of faith on their foreheads, were parked nearby as he spoke.

"I'm all of Afghanistan, everyone is happy, and the situation is better day by day," said the official, Mohammed Zindani. "All the people of Afghanistan want this government."

# Deutsche Telekom nears \$6.1 billion sale of dutch unit

Deutsche Telekom AG will use proceeds from the sale of its Dutch unit to acquire a greater stake in T-Mobile US Inc., deepening its shift to the US, where it leads the industry in the next generation of mobile technology.

Warburg Pincus and Apax Partners will purchase T-Mobile Netherlands for €5.1 billion (\$6.1 billion) from Deutsche Telekom and venture partner Tele2, which owns a 25% stake, the private equity firms said Tuesday. Bloomberg reported on Monday that the German company could announce a sale of the unit soon.

Deutsche Telekom will use some of the proceeds to help fund a deal with SoftBank Group Corp. to increase its holding in the US. The Japanese company said it will buy a

SoftBank will swap part of its T-Mobile US stake for an initial 225 million shares of Deutsche Telekom. The German firm will then use \$2.4 billion of proceeds from the Dutch sale to pick up another 20 million T-Mobile shares, according to a statement.

Deutsche Telekom intends to offset potential dilution to earnings per share through share buybacks in the medium term, Hoettges said on the call.

For Warburg and Apax, their purchase will be one of the largest transactions in the European telecom sector this year, according to data compiled by Bloomberg. Warburg Pincus and Apax previously teamed up in 2019 to take UK satellite company Inmarsat Plc private in a \$3.4-billion buyout deal. The value of Tele2's stake is about €860 million. The sale had also attracted interest from Apollo Global Management Inc. and Indian billionaire Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Industries Ltd, Bloomberg News has reported.
